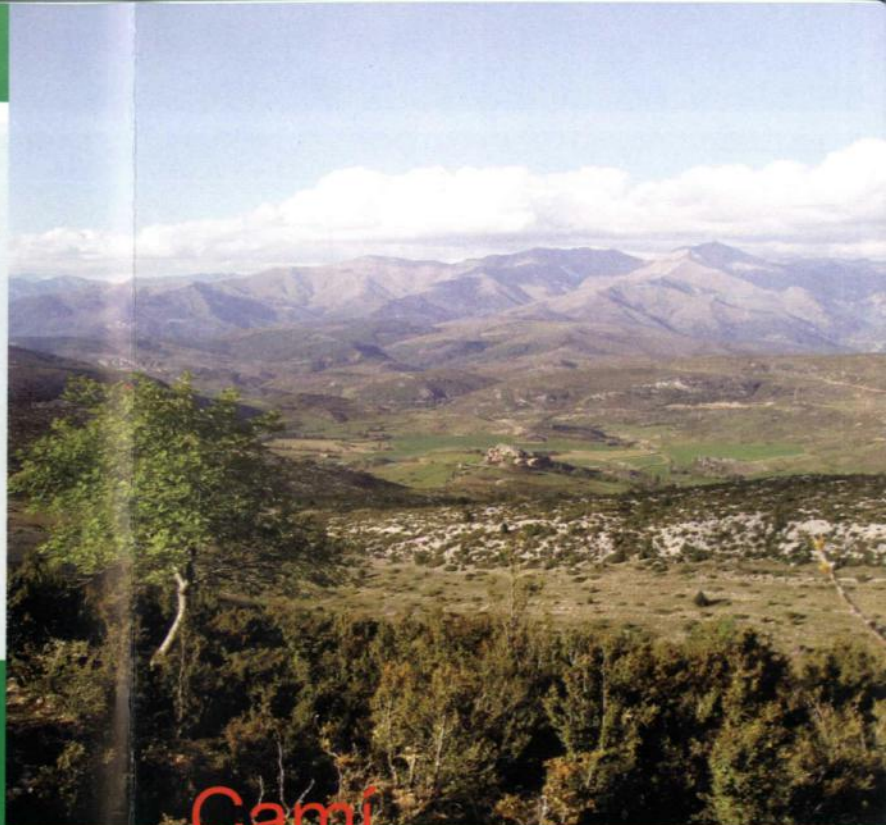

The final part of the trail climbs up the field of the **Avedoga**. Here is here the hiker will want to pay close attention to one of the protagonists of the route—the fir tree. The fir is a natural witness of an fir tree that covered everything and which disappeared centuries before due to the actions of mankind.

Local tradition explains that the Avedoga was the place where the wolves of the region hid and that this was on of the reasons for their disappearance.

After hiking for some time, a garden of low bushes will take us to the inhospitable mountain rim where the land drops away to reveal **La Terreta**.

It is the territory of the shawms, kestrels, common vultures and the emblematic bearded vulture.

In front of you, below **the Portús**, finally appears the cut of a slanted sword in the calcareous rock. The cut is about twenty meters high and three metres wide. Here you can find vegetation such as the corona de rei and the orella de l'ós.

Throughout the settlement of the Ribagorça this location has been an important place for the movement of people and animals.

Characteristics

Exit from and arrival to the village of Adons

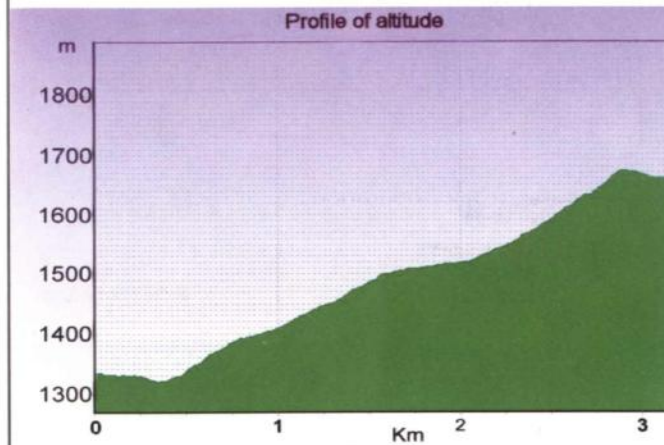
Length: 3,2 km – one way

Duration: 1 hour 30 minuts

Minimum altitude: 1346 m

Maximum altitude: 1675 m

Elevation Change: 329 m



Remember

All of the route is signposted with wooden poles and marked with green and white paint. There are directional signs in the more complicated locations.

Wear good footwear, suitable clothes and bring water with you. The water sources along the route are scarce.

Don't forget to take a camera, some binoculars and a map of the area.

The weather can change abruptly and drastically in the wilderness. Therefore, be careful and pay close attention to the weather predictions prior to departure.
